Family of birds have turned Royal Mail postbox into nest

A family of birds have turned a remote Royal Mail postbox into their nest in Scotland.

Bird photographer William Dickson spotted the red mailbox on the road to Uisken Beach on the Isle of Mull while holidaying on the Hebridean island with his wife Maria McGowan, according to Metro.

The couple snapped photos of it after discovering that someone had ordered it off limits with a handwritten sign saying: "Bird nesting. Please do not use until further notice."

Dickson, 62, said: "I knew it was active when I saw the bird."

"We actually saw a Starling fly out of the postbox and that is what drew our

attention to it.

"I thought it was quite amusing. Quite a great place to build a nest as no other birds will attack it."

He uploaded the pictures to Facebook where over 3,000 people have shared the post.

A spokesperson for Royal Mail said: "It is something we do, do and we are looking into whether it was us in this case."

Royal Mail has previously said that workers will regularly check to see when the birds have flown the nest, before the postbox is thoroughly cleaned and reopened.

Starlings usually lay four to six eggs in mid-April.

Researcher protects swimming deer from sharks

A researcher shark-spotting off the California coast shared video of his rare encounter with a swimming deer he steered away from the sharks.

Sean Van Sommeran said he had "seen a couple sharks" May 9 before he encountered an apparently disoriented deer swimming in circles around Monterey Bay, upi.com reported.

Van Sommeran said in the video of the

encounter that it was 'bizarre' to find the deer swimming directionless in the ocean.

The video showed the researcher positioning his boat between the deer and the sharks while attempting to guide the mammal back to shore.

The footage showed the deer made it safely to shore before the boat drew the attention of a nearby shark.

Small truck carries two cars at once in Arkansas

A perplexed driver in Arkansas, the US, captured video of a strange and unique sight — a pickup truck carrying two cars in its bed.

The video, recorded last week on a road in Camden, showed a pickup truck with two cars-side by side in the bed, each hanging partially off one side of

the truck, UPI reported.

"I have never seen this," the filmer said in the footage. "Only in Camden, Arkansas, will you see two cars half on and half off. That isn't even a tow truck."

"I was driving into Camden when I saw the truck with two cars in the bed of the truck," the man wrote.

Patients at care home went two months without bath or shower

Patients at a care home in Liverpool didn't have a bath or shower for nearly two months, the health watchdog said.

Woolton Manor Care Home remains in special measures following a damning report by the Care Quality Commission (CQC).

The home in Allerton road showed serious failings in every single area and was rated "inadequate for the third time in a row," Metro reported.

Inspectors said two patients had gone seven weeks without a bath or shower, while another went six without and two others hadn't had one for five weeks.

They were also told that one patient had gone for two months without a shower, and one person said they only had a bath or shower once a week.

The February inspection found the 'smell strongly of urine' and patients were at 'risk of unsafe and inappropriate care'.

No action had been taken to rectify the problems that had been found during the previous CQC inspection, the report said.

"We found that the provider had not taken appropriate action to address our concerns and all of the breaches we identified previously remained," it said.

"This meant people who lived at the home continued to be placed at serious risk. The rating for the service has not changed. The service remains inadequate and in special measures."

Patients had no access to 'social or recreational activities' and inspectors were told 'there was nothing to do at the home'.
